



College Admissions Process

- Electronic application preferred by most colleges
 - ✓ Georgia colleges-create an account at www.gacollege411.org
 - ✓ ADHERE TO DEADLINES.
- ✓ Submit most recent transcript
 - ✓ Online via gacollege411- free
 - ✓ Paper copy from counseling- \$5 per copy. 24 hr processing time; student must pick up and mail to college
- Be sure you have completed everything on the admissions checklist
 - ✓ Incomplete applications are not viewed by colleges
 - ✓ Application fees/fee waivers MUST be submitted
- Only submit those items that the college is requesting



- ✓ Submit Letter of Recommendation information form to your counselor with all necessary college forms – if required:
 - ✓ Not every college requires a letter of recommendation
 - ✓ Submit Student Report Forms the same as you would a letter of recommendation
- ✓ Letters of Recommendations have a <u>2 week</u> turn around, so please PLAN AHEAD!
 - ✓ There are 800+ seniors at PRHS; 90% are college bound

✓ Early Decision (ED)

Students who apply under early decision make a commitment to enroll at the college if admitted and offered a satisfactory financial aid package. Application deadlines are usually in October or November with a mid-to-late-December notification date.

Early Action (EA)

EA is a nonbinding program in which a student can receive an early admission decision from several colleges, but is not required to accept an admission offer before May 1. Application deadlines are usually in October or November with a mid-to-late-December notification date.

Regular Admission (Regular Application or Regular Decision)

Regular Application students have additional months of time to complete and submit their applications and they have no restrictions on the number schools they can apply to.

Rolling Admission

Colleges with this type of admission procedure consider each student's application as soon as all the required credentials have been received (e.g., high school record, test scores). The college usually notifies applicants of its decision within two weeks.

Deferred admission

Students applying under the early application process are "deferred" from being an early applicant and are "pushed" back to be part of the regular admission pool of applicants

Open Admission

This refers to a policy in which colleges accept any high school graduate, regardless of grades, until all spaces are filled. Many technical colleges have an open admission policy.
